Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: CIBC Global Technology Fund (referred to as the *Fund*) seeks to provide long-term growth through capital appreciation by investing globally, primarily in companies that are involved in the development, application, production, or distribution of scientific and technology based products and services.

Investment Strategies: The Fund uses fundamental bottom-up research to construct a well-diversified portfolio that focuses on stocks expected to outperform the sector over future periods. The Fund invests in the following sub-industries: hardware, software, computer services, communication services, health care, and internet.

Risk

The Fund is a global equity fund that is suitable for long term investors who can tolerate medium to high investment risk.

For the period ended December 31, 2023, the Fund's overall level of risk remained as discussed in the simplified prospectus.

Results of Operations

The Fund's portfolio advisor is CIBC Asset Management Inc. (referred to as *CAMI* or the *Portfolio Advisor*). The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the period ended December 31, 2023. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The Fund's net asset value increased by 20% during the period, from \$326,252 as at December 31, 2022 to \$391,707 as at December 31, 2023. Positive investment performance was partially offset by net redemptions of \$31,442, resulting in an overall increase in net asset value.

Class A units of the Fund posted a return of 30.3% for the period. The Fund's primary benchmarks, the MSCI World Information Technology Index and the MSCI World Index (referred to as the *primary benchmarks*), returned 49.5% and 21.1%, respectively, for the same period. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the primary benchmarks' return. See the section *Past Performance* for the returns of other classes of units offered by the Fund.

The monetary policy environment whipsawed markets during the period, with rising interest rates in the first half of the year as central banks fought inflation followed by falling inflation and a hold on interest rate increases in the second half of the year. Advances in generative artificial intelligence (referred to as *AI*) affected not only information technology, but a wide range of other sectors. Information technology cost optimization among businesses affected software industry revenues, while inventory corrections due to post-pandemic demand normalization affected semiconductor and hardware companies. The breakout of conflict in October between Israel and Hamas also affected markets.

Stock selection in the information technology and communications services sectors contributed to the Fund's performance. Individual holdings that significantly contributed to performance included overweight exposures to NVIDIA Corp., Palo Alto Networks Inc. and Broadcom Inc.

Stock selection in the health care sector detracted from the Fund's performance. Individual holdings that significantly detracted from performance included overweight exposures to Johnson & Johnson, Merck & Co., Inc. and Rogers Corp.

The Portfolio Advisor added Meta Platforms Inc., salesforce.com inc., Amazon.com Inc., Adobe Inc., Advanced Micro Devices Inc., ServiceNow Inc., Nintendo Co. Ltd. and Trade Desk Inc. to the Fund. The new focus on efficiency at Meta Platforms offers significant potential opportunities for cost savings. Salesforce.com has also shifted to operating efficiency, offering what the Portfolio Advisor sees as room for significant margin improvement over the next several quarters.

Amazon.com is experiencing weak demand for Amazon Web Services and uncertain consumer demand, but the Portfolio Advisor expects the company to benefit from enterprise cloud demand related to generative AI. The Portfolio Advisor also expects Adobe to benefit from generative AI, which is already integrated into its products and is being monetized.

Advanced Micro Devices could become the only viable alternative supplier of Al chips for IT architecture hyperscalers such as Amazon Web Services, Microsoft Azure and Oracle. ServiceNow's efforts to

have customers embrace AI in their workflows could drive increased upselling without a corresponding decline in customers.

The Portfolio Advisor expects Nintendo to expand its gaming platform with improved hardware in its next console refresh, while monetizing well-established intellectual property to offset an expected drop in hardware revenue. The Portfolio Advisor sees transitional factors behind Trade Desk's fourth-quarter earnings guidance, which disappointed many investors, and thinks platform expansion could give the company significant growth potential that is currently underappreciated by the market.

The Portfolio Advisor sold Texas Instruments Inc., Applied Materials Inc., TELUS Corp., Enphase Energy Inc., The Walt Disney Company, Electronic Arts Inc., Intuit Inc. and Accenture PLC. Texas Instruments announced a costly capacity expansion and faced an expected downturn in the semiconductor market. Applied Materials is expected to be more negatively affected than its peers by cyclically weak demand.

TELUS faces high interest rate hurdles to potential spin-offs via IPOs and increasing competition from Rogers after it bought Shaw Communication Inc. Risks to Enphase Energy's U.S. business are greater than the Portfolio Advisor previously thought, with strong growth in Europe not enough of an offset. The turnaround at Disney is now expected to take longer. There are risks to the company's plan to raise streaming service prices given lower-than-expected customer loyalty.

The Portfolio Advisor exited Electronic Arts because the Fund was too exposed to video gaming and the company's sports title portfolio is losing the FIFA soccer brand. Intuit's future growth is expected to be in the consumer and small- to mid-sized business markets and not the more attractive enterprise market. The Portfolio Advisor no longer expects Accenture to benefit as much from generative AI in IT services, with demand in that important company segment looking generally lacklustre.

Recent Developments

Effective April 27, 2023, Bryan Houston was appointed Chair of the Independent Review Committee.

The COVID-19 pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine war have disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. This has resulted in significant volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses and financial markets. Inflation has increased in many markets across the globe, leading central banks to raise interest rates in order to counter rapidly rising prices. These factors may adversely affect the performance of the Fund. The Manager continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Related Party Transactions

CIBC and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the Fund, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager

CIBC is the Fund's manager (referred to as the *Manager*). CIBC receives management fees with respect to the Fund's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of

each respective class of units of the Fund as described in the section entitled *Management Fees*. The Manager compensates its wholesalers in connection with their marketing activities regarding the Fund. From time to time. CIBC may invest in units of the Fund.

Trustee

CIBC Trust Corporation, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Fund's trustee (referred to as the *Trustee*). The Trustee holds title to the Fund's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its unitholders.

Portfolio Advisor

The portfolio advisor provides, or arranges to provide, investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund. CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Fund's portfolio advisor.

Distributor

Dealers and other firms sell the units of the Fund to investors. These dealers and other firms include CIBC's related dealers such as the principal distributor, CIBC Securities Inc. (referred to as *CIBC SI*), the CIBC Investor's Edge discount brokerage division of CIBC Investor Services Inc. (referred to as *CIBC ISI*), the CIBC Imperial Investor Service division of CIBC ISI, and the CIBC Wood Gundy division of CIBC World Markets Inc. (referred to as *CIBC WM*). CIBC SI, CIBC ISI, and CIBC WM are wholly-owned subsidiaries of CIBC.

CIBC may pay trailing commissions to these dealers and firms, in connection with the sale of units of the Fund. These dealers and other firms may pay a portion of these trailing commissions to their advisors who sell units of the Fund to investors.

Brokerage Arrangements and Soft Dollars

The Portfolio Advisor makes decisions, including the selection of markets and dealers and the negotiation of commissions, with respect to the purchase and sale of portfolio securities, certain derivative products and the execution of portfolio transactions. Brokerage business may be allocated by the Portfolio Advisor to CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., each a subsidiary of CIBC. CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp. may also earn spreads on the sale of fixed income securities and other securities and certain derivative products to the Fund. A spread is the difference between the bid and ask prices for a security in the applicable marketplace, with respect to the execution of portfolio transactions. The spread will differ based upon various factors such as the type and liquidity of the security.

Dealers, including CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., may furnish goods and services, other than order execution, to the Portfolio Advisor in partial exchange for processing trades through them (referred to in the industry as "soft dollar" arrangements). These goods and services are paid for with a portion of the brokerage commissions and assist the Portfolio Advisor with investment decision-making services for the Fund or relate directly to the execution of portfolio transactions on behalf of the Fund.

During the period, the Fund paid brokerage commissions and other fees of \$4,474 to CIBC WM and \$7,151 to CIBC World Markets Corp. Spreads associated with fixed income and other securities are not ascertainable and, for that reason, cannot be included when determining these amounts.

Fund Transactions

The Fund may enter into one or more of the following transactions (referred to as the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the standing instructions issued by the IRC:

- invest in or hold equity securities of CIBC or issuers related to a portfolio sub-advisor;
- invest in or hold non-exchange-traded debt securities of CIBC or an issuer related to CIBC, with terms-to-maturity of 365 days or more, issued in a primary offering and in the secondary market;
- make an investment in the securities of an issuer for which CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC (referred to as a *Related Dealer* or the *Related Dealers*) acts as an underwriter during the offering of the securities or at any time during the 60-day period following the completion of the offering of such securities (in the case of a "private placement" offering, in accordance with the exemptive relief order granted by the Canadian securities regulatory authorities and in accordance with the policies and procedures relating to such investment);
- purchase equity or debt securities from or sell them to a Related Dealer, where it is acting as principal;
- undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where a Related Dealer is the counterparty;
- purchase securities from or sell securities to another investment fund or a managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate; and
- engage in in-specie transfers by receiving portfolio securities from, or delivering portfolio securities to, a managed account or another investment fund managed by the Manager or an affiliate, in respect of a purchase or redemption of units in the fund, subject to certain conditions.

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred or reported to the IRC by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with a condition imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the Fund's custodian (referred to as the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds all cash and securities for the Fund and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash or securities that the Custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the Fund including record-keeping and processing of foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for the services of the Custodian directly related to the execution of portfolio transactions by the Fund are paid by CAMI and/or the dealer(s) directed by CAMI, up to the amount of the credits generated under soft dollar arrangements from trading on behalf of the Fund during that month. All other fees and spreads for the services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager and charged to the Fund on a recoverable basis. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company Inc. (referred to as *CIBC GSS*) provides certain services to the Fund, including securities lending, fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. Such servicing fees are paid by the Manager and charged to the Fund on a recoverable basis. CIBC indirectly owns a 50% interest in CIBC GSS.

Management Fees

The Fund, either directly or indirectly, pays CIBC an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the Fund. Management fees are based on the Fund's net asset value and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CIBC in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, office overhead expenses and trailing commissions are paid by CIBC out of the management fees received from the Fund. The Fund is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CIBC. Refer to the Simplified Prospectus for the annual management fee rate for each class of units.

The following table shows a breakdown of the services received in consideration of the management fees, as a percentage of the management fees collected from the Fund for the period ended December 31, 2023. These amounts do not include waived fees or absorbed expenses.

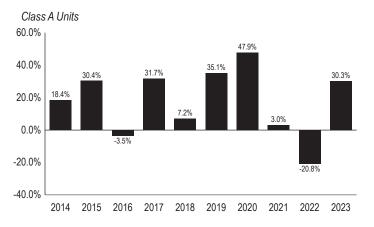

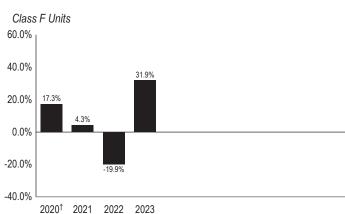
